# Managing Your Shoreline: Six Key Steps



#### Identify Options

All shorelines are unique.

Management techniques may range from planting marsh grasses to building a hardened structure.







#### DIY or Professional

You may manage your shoreline on your own, or rely on a professional. Contractors can provide design, permitting, and construction services.





## Consult Permit Issuers in Advance

Local wetlands board staff will help you understand the regulations and permits related to your proposed project.





#### Complete Applications

Most shoreline projects require a
Joint Permit Application, available
from the Army Corps of Engineers
and submitted to the Virginia Marine
Resource Commission.







## Participate in Project Review Process

You may need to submit additional information, allow site visits from government staff, or attend a public hearing





#### Get Started

Permits in hand? You'll have at least 18 months to complete your project, with additional time available by obtaining an extension
